RED LETTERS STUDY



PURPOSE

Jesus' public ministry here on earth was roughly 3 years. We can assume, based on John 21:25, that not everything Jesus talked about or said was documented. Per John, "Were every one of them written, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written."

From the teachings of Jesus, we have over 2/3rds of the New Testament authors trying to unpackage the gift Jesus gave them personally. From those writings we have hundreds of thousands of Books, millions of words and countless hours upon hours of sermons – all because of the words Jesus spoke now represented by the "Red Letters" found in your Bible.

If so much commentary can come from other people trying to better understand the words of Jesus, we should probably spend more time studying those words of Jesus and how they relate to us as individuals rather than relying upon someone else's efforts.

Jesus' Bible

The Bible as we know it was being lived out during the time of Jesus and the Old Testament was not yet in a "Book" form. The CODEX technology was not yet available. It was mostly in separate scrolls only available in the Synagogues of each community and even then most Synagogues did not have a complete set. The Jewish culture was centered around knowing the text. They memorized it, prayed it daily, and organized their lives around remembering what God had done for them. We have to know Jesus' Bible to better understand His words.

Jesus' Words

When studying the words of Jesus, we can safely assume that when He speaks, His words have been carefully weighed and are significant. Jesus quotes from His Bible throughout His teachings to the 12. When studying the words of Jesus', assume He is referencing His Bible and seek to find the reference there that is applicable to His words.
